



Newborn Well Child Visit Schedule

Well child visits are vital to track your child’s growth and development. They also create a strong bond with your pediatrician.

The American Academy of Pediatrics schedule below includes at what age each of the well child visits should be done and what to expect during your child’s exam.

AGE	WELL CHILD EXAM INCLUDES:
By 1 Week:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Jaundice check • Weight check • Feeding issues • Metabolic screening • Newborn vaccines (if due)
2 Weeks:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Weight check • Physical exam • Newborn vaccines (if due)
1 Month:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Weight check • Physical exam • Vaccines
2 Months:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Physical exam • Growth and development • Vaccines
4 Months:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Physical exam • Growth and development • Vaccines
6 Months:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Physical exam • Growth and development • Vaccines
6 - 12 Months:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • After 1st tooth appears, but no later than the 1st birthday, first Dental Visit
9 Months:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Physical exam • Growth and development • Vaccines



12 Months:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Physical exam • Growth and development • TB skin test (if due) • Finger stick (hemoglobin) • Vaccines
15 Months:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Physical exam • Growth and development • Lead screening (before 24 months) • Vaccines
18 Months:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Physical exam • Growth and development • Vaccines
2 Years:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Physical exam • Growth and development • Vaccines
2.5 Years (30 months):	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Physical exam • Growth and development • Vaccines
3 Years:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Physical exam • Growth and development • TB skin test (if due)
4 Years & Older:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Physical exam • Growth and development • Vaccines • Annual check-up recommended, and if needed, may include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Finger stick (hemoglobin) ○ Urinalysis, and/or ○ Vision/hearing screening
