

## Important Information about Hurricane Ian for CCP Florida Medicaid (MMA) Members

## **Medication Refills**

Governor Ron DeSantis declared a state of emergency related to Hurricane Ian (Executive Order #22-218), which means you may refill your prescription medications early.

Community Care Plan (CCP) will continue to follow the Governor's Executive Order and during this State of Emergency period, exceptions have also been made for authorizations and claims payment. Please see below for more details.

## Authorizations

- The following critical services will be approved without any form of authorization during the current state of emergency:
  - Chemotherapy services
  - Dialysis services
  - Durable Medical Equipment (DME) services
  - Home Health services
  - Hospital services
  - Nursing facility services
- Providers shall submit minimum documentation for Managed Care Plan care coordination and discharge planning purposes

## **Claims Payment Exceptions Process**

- Medically necessary services provided under the current state of emergency are covered regardless of provider network participation status and/or service limits
- CCP will make payment exceptions for medically necessary services rendered in good faith without a prior authorization due to Hurricane Ian
- CCP Claims submission requirements will remain the same
